EARLY MORNING WET PLAY: INFANTS

In the past, parents have been asked to bring their children into the Infant Hall, say 'goodbye' and then leave the building. With the additional 30 children in Reception, plus the many new children who have joined us in Years 1 & 2, to say it was crowded, was an understatement! Plus, with so many parents with buggies, it did pose a considerable Health & Safety risk.



Therefore, as we did on Monday and from now on:

- when it is wet, between 8.55am and 9.10am, please bring your child to the main door to the Infant building where myself and/or Mrs Jones will be waiting;
- please say your 'goodbyes' at this point;
- the Infant teaching assistants: Mrs Morgan; Mrs Farnon; Mrs Busby and Mrs Bristow, will then escort the children along the corridor into the Infant Hall where they will join their class sitting in a row;
- when the bell goes at 9.10am, the children will be led to their classes by the teacher.

It did work really well on Monday, so thank you for your co-operation as we continue with this new procedure.

HAIRSTYLES AND UNIFORM

From Tuesday 5th January 2010, we ask that all children and parents comply with the new guidelines for hairstyles. We have introduced this due to the increasingly fussy styles with coloured accessories that the children are wearing. As decorative as they may be, we do not consider that they are suitable for school.



- All hair that is shoulder length or longer (girls and boys) should always be securely tied back.
- Any beads, hair ties, scrunchies, clips etc...should be **blue or black** and as plain as possible.



Again, I thank you in advance for your co-operation in this matter.

Please ensure your child leaves home looking smart and in full uniform each morning. This is an important element of the children's shared sense of identity at school, as well as promoting a self-pride in their own appearance.

The following are a key element of the school uniform and must be worn at all times:

- ***black school shoes;***
- ***a white shirt / polo shirt;***
- ***white, navy, grey or black PLAIN socks;***
- ***a royal blue cardigan, jumper or sweatshirt, with or without the South Norwood Bee.***

EDUCATIONAL VISITS

In order to keep costs down, we are using public transport: buses, trains and trams far more than we have done and we do then increase the amount of supervision necessary for such travel.
